



Second Stop: BASILICA of ST MARY MAJOR

The Papal Basilica of St Mary Major (Santa Maria Maggiore) is the oldest and most important Marian sanctuary in Western Christendom. According to the traditional story of its foundation, the Virgin Mary appeared in a dream to the Roman patrician, John, and Pope

Liberius, exhorting them to build a church dedicated to her on the exact spot where she would cause snow to fall. On the morning of 5 August in the year 358, snow was seen on the Esquiline Hill, the highest of Rome's hills, outlining the perimeter of what was to become the new church. This tradition gives a special nobility to St Mary Major's – marking it out as a kind of Marian relic, a place that was desired and planned by the Mother of God herself. The Basilica is home to the most important of all Marian icons, the Salus Populi Romani (Our Lady Saviour of the Roman People). Tradition attributes the artwork to St Luke the Evangelist and patron of painters. The relic of the holy crib, the bedding on which the baby Jesus was laid, which is under the Papal altar, recalls the importance of the Basilica as the 'Bethlehem of the West'. Among the other important relics contained within the basilica are the mortal remains of St Matthew, St Jerome, and Saint Pope Pius V, the Rosary Pope. It was in St Mary Major's that Pope Adrian II welcomed, in the year 867, Saints Cyril and Methodius and approved the use of the Slavic texts in the liturgy.

From the Desk of Msgr. James: Friday, December 27th, is the Feast Day of Saint John the Evangelist. There

is a custom of blessing wine on this feast day because Saint John was preserved from death after having been given a cup of poison wine to drink. A serpent miraculously appeared in the cup as a warning. Any parishioner who would like to have wine blessed may place it on a table provided in the sanctuary before 8:00am Mass that morning. Mass will be at St. Peter Church that morning.

Sunday, December 29th is the Feast of the Holy Family. The Blessing of Families will take place at the conclusion of the weekend Masses. We will be happy to bless <u>individuals</u> whose family members may be in nursing homes or living away from home, extending the blessing to them also.

Sunday, January 5th, is the Solemnity of the Epiphany. Water, salt, chalk, and incense will be solemnly blessed before the 4:30pm Mass on Saturday and before the 8:00am Mass on Sunday. Because these blessings are very complex and take a long time, confessions will not be heard on Saturday afternoon or on Sunday morning before Mass. We will begin the blessing at 4:00pm on Saturday and at 7:30am on Sunday. You are most welcome to attend these blessings. The blessed chalk and holy water will be available to take home after Mass, along with instructions on how to mark your homes with the Blessing of the Three Kings. Small bottles will be available for the water, but you may also bring your own container if you would like to take a larger quantity. If you would like to have salt blessed for home use please bring it in a container, marked with your name and place it on the table provided in the sanctuary. The blessed salt may be used for cooking and a small quantity may be placed in the four corners of your home to protect your home from evil and danger.

You may have noticed that four reliquaries have been placed on the main altar between the candle sticks. It is an ancient custom to have the relics of the saints on the altar, as well as in the altar. The relics of the saints remind us of the Communion of the Saints, to which we belong by right of our baptism, and the presence of the saints at the heavenly liturgy. The four saints whose relics are on the altar are, from left to right, Saint Pius X, pope; Saint Maria Goretti, virgin and martyr; Saint Catherine Laboure, virgin; and Saint Ann, mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary. All are first-class relics, meaning that they are a small piece of the body of the saint. Second-class relics are something that was owned by or used by the saint. Third-class relics are small pieces of cloth that have been touched to a first-class relic.

The reliquary that holds the relic of Saint Pius X was purchased in memory of Mr. George Pavelko by the pierogi workers. The reliquary containing the relic of Saint Ann, was purchased in memory of my Grandmother, Mrs. Anna Etter, and my Mother, Mrs. Nancy James. The reliquary containing the relic of St. Catherine Laboure, was purchased in memory of Matilda Haddad. The Saint Maria reliquary may still be memorialized for a donation of \$70.00. If you would like to memorialize a reliquary, please contact Lina at the rectory.
